To the Saints at Bethany:

***"If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come."
(2 Cor 5:17)***

Ready or not, yet another calendar is coming down and a new one going up. I was thinking about the passage above as I contemplated another New Year's Day. As the years go on every passing year might seem less "new." Another ball drop in Times Square, another load of confetti, and another verse of "Auld Lang Syne" -- we've seen it all before, many times. This calls to mind what King Solomon wrote in Ecclesiastes: "What has been is what will be, and what has been done is what will be done, and there is nothing new under the sun" (Ecc 1:9).

At the time Solomon wrote that, it was true. But subsequently, something new has happened under the sun. A man who died walked out of the grave, never to die again. The risen Lord Jesus once appeared to John the Evangelist and said "Behold, I am making all things new" (Rev 21:5). Because Christ is risen, it's not just New Year's Day that brings something new, but newness of life is an ongoing reality for all who belong to Him. In the catechism, Luther writes about what it means to be baptized into Christ: "It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever."

Every day is not only New Year's Day for us, but New Life Day! As we worship through the month of January, we will continue to see how we live the new life in Christ. We will contemplate some of the important events of Jesus' life, we will see how He joins His life to ours, and we will celebrate the new life we have in Him!

January 4: The Epiphany of our Lord: "Singing Camels of Sheba" (Isaiah 60:1-6)

January 18: The Confession of St. Peter: "Charging the Gates of Hell" (Mark 8:27-35)

January 25: Sanctity of Human Life Sunday: "Wonderfully Made" (Isaiah 49:1-7)
