## "Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Romans 5:1

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This month, we celebrate the Reformation of the Christian church once again. The church needed to be reformed because it had lost the central teaching of salvation by grace through faith. It had allowed the teaching that faith required works. Salvation by our works places the burden for salvation on our shoulders and brings uncertainty into our relationship with God. Consciences became troubled by the question of whether I am good enough for God to love me, and there was no peace.

In our daily lives, we are often surrounded by uncertainty. We face questions about the future, concerns for our loved ones, and the internal struggles of our own hearts. In a world that often seems to be in turmoil, where can we find a steadfast and unshakable peace? The Apostle Paul, in his letter to the Romans, points us to the very source of this profound peace: our justification by faith in Jesus Christ.

What does it mean to be "justified by faith"? It is the beautiful and foundational truth of our Christian belief. It is the declaration from God Himself that though we are sinners, we are made right in His sight BY HIM. This isn't because of anything we have done, any good work we have accomplished, or any merit we have earned. It is a gift, given to us freely through the sacrificial death and resurrection of His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. By faith, we receive this gift, trusting not in our own righteousness, but in the perfect righteousness of Christ that now covers us.

This justification is not a temporary state, but an eternal reality. It is peace that surpasses all understanding because it is not dependent on our circumstances. When we are troubled by the world around us, when we feel the weight of our own sin, when we feel the weight of the burden of this life, we can return to this foundational truth. We **have** peace with God because He makes peace with us. The hostility that our sin created between us and God has been overcome. We are no longer His enemies, but His beloved children.

This peace is the assurance in our conscience that allows us to approach God in prayer, not with fear of condemnation, but with the confidence of a child speaking to their loving Father. It allows us to rest in Him. It is the strength that empowers us to love and serve our neighbors, knowing that our ultimate standing before God is secure. It is the hope that anchors our souls in the midst of life's storms, for if God is for us, who can be against us?

May the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

### NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT

It was great to see so many of you attend our church picnic earlier last month! The food was delicious and I had fun calling BINGO for the entertainment that afternoon. Thanks to all those who helped with the food and setup/clean-up duties! A fun time was had by all!

I'd like to thank everyone who attended our September 21<sup>st</sup> voters meeting. Your attendance and participation is greatly appreciated! As most of you have probably heard by now, we have extended our 4<sup>th</sup> call to a new pastor last week. The congregation voted to call Pastor Brian "Azor" Cigelske from Zion in New Holstein. Pastor Azor came to visit us with his family this past Monday evening so he could meet our congregation and allow them to ask him any questions. We enjoyed a nice time of fellowship with some pizza and gave him and his family a tour of the parsonage. I'd like to personally thank all of those who attended and made him and his family feel welcome! It really was an enjoyable evening! Please keep Pastor Azor and his family in your prayers over the coming weeks, as they deliberate between their current call, our call, and a call from another church in MI that he recently received as well. May the Lord give him the guidance and wisdom to choose the path that He has set forth for him.

In addition to voting for a new pastor, we also announced a capital campaign at the recent voter's meeting. The purpose of the campaign is two-fold: to replace the air conditioning system and to renovate the parsonage. The current air conditioning system is 20 years old. The unit in the rear of the sanctuary no longer works and parts are no longer available. Depending on how much money we raise, we will either replace the broken unit with a new one, which would cost us approximately \$9200, or we would replace all 4 units for a cost of approximately \$29,000. As for the parsonage, there are a number of renovations that need to be made there. We are currently in the process of getting estimates, but at a high level, we think it could cost use between \$15,000-\$20,000. We do have some funds that are immediately available to start work on the parsonage. We have approximately \$8,000 in the building improvement fund and about \$7,000 in the parsonage account. Please prayerfully consider giving to either project. You can mark your envelopes "Capital campaign" to ensure the funds are used for this. I'd like to thank those who have so generously donated already!





### Evangelizing at the Latin Barber Shop – Friday, September 19th

Last Friday, September 19th, I visited the Latin Barber Shop in Sheboygan. As part of my ministry, I like to visit places where Hispanics gather, to meet new people and seek opportunities to share the Gospel with them. I spent about three hours there and had the chance to talk with several individuals. I always wear my clerical collar so people can identify me as a church worker.

While I was there, one person pulled me aside to a corner because he needed someone to talk to. He began sharing the struggles he was facing. I gladly listened, offered him advice, and when he asked, I prayed for him. After the prayer, I gave him a hug, and he left. I could see how that man, who initially seemed tired and troubled, walked away filled with joy—blessed by God right there in that barbershop! I thank God for placing me in the right place to share His words of life and encouragement.

Later, I met a 20-year-old young woman. We spent quite some time talking about God. At one point, she asked if I was a Catholic priest. I told her I wasn't—that I'm a Lutheran pastor. She explained that she had been looking for a Catholic church to visit but hadn't found one she liked yet. I told her, "God put you in my path today so you can find the right place. I want to introduce you to a church where the Gospel is preached exactly as it is, and the sacraments are administered according to the Lord's intention."

She responded, "What is it like? Tell me more. What is the Lutheran Church?" I explained what we believe, teach, and confess in the Lutheran church. She said, "That sounds interesting."

I invited her to our Sunday service, and she replied, "I'll be there, God willing." And she came! Not only that—she brought her mother and younger sister too. After the Divine Service, I asked them, "How did you like it?" and all three said they really enjoyed the service and would come back. Praise God for bringing them to His house!

Later that day, I sent them a message thanking them for joining us. They replied, "We are really happy to have been in God's house today," and also asked, "Can you say a prayer tomorrow? It's our mother's birthday." I responded, "Yes, with great pleasure." Early the next morning, I prayed for her and sent her a written birthday prayer.

The work with this family will continue. I thank God for placing them in my path so that His Kingdom may continue to grow.
