Isaiah 9:6-7 - "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and His Name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of His government and peace, there will be no end, on the throne of David and over His kingdom to establish and uphold it with justice and righteousness."

December 26<sup>th</sup>, The Feast of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr.

On the second day of Christmas, my true love gave to me, the Feast of St. Stephen. The presents are all open, and the meal is nothing but leftovers. The world is starting to go back to its routines, even if we can take a couple more days off. It's December 26th, and many people flock to the stores to get wrapping paper and ornaments for 75% off. We have turned our thoughts to how we can get all this cleaned up.

In the days before Christmas, it is easy to get lost in the worldly happenings of buying gifts, meal preparations, family visits, final decorations, and Christmas parties. Our thoughts are so consumed with the here and now of the season that we often quickly forget the real purpose of Christmas. Then, as fast as it comes, it seems Christmas is in the past again.

The church doesn't move as fast as we do. Christmas Day starts the 12 days of Christmas with a new celebration of God's gifts each day. On the second day of Christmas, the church calendar invades our idyllic visions of peace on earth and goodwill to men with the story of St. Stephen. Stephen was a man filled with the Holy Spirit who boldly confessed it before his accusers when asked to give an account of his faith. His accusers were the very same people who had cried out for Jesus to be crucified. Now, for his confession of faith, they do the same to Stephen by stoning him to death.

The story of Stephen reminds us that Jesus told us, "In this world, you will have trouble." He also preached that blessed are those who are persecuted and reviled for my sake, for theirs is the kingdom of God. "But take heart, I have overcome the world!"

Stephen's martyrdom reveals the true meaning of Christmas. It brings our thoughts back to the reason Jesus was born. At Christmas, God comes to rescue Stephen from his enemy...death. At Christmas, God loved the whole world so much that He gave His only begotten son, to be born of Mary and laid in a manger, to grow up then and embrace the cross of suffering to save Stephen, and you and me, from death.

At the moment of his stoning, Stephen is quoted as having looked up to see heaven open up and the Son of Man seated at the right hand of the throne of God. As he dies, Jesus is there for him, which is where he will be for us. We may not be martyred, or we may be, but we do know that when that time comes because of Christmas and Easter, Jesus will be with those who die in faith.

That is the real reason for the season. That is what we truly celebrate. The gift of God is salvation for us, heaven open to us, Jesus with us. To us, a child is born; to us, a son is given! Of his reign, there will be no end. Amen
