To the Saints at Bethany:

Where do you stand on Christmas music? Some people don't mind listening to Christmas in July. Others don't mind Christmas music, just at the proper time (which can lead to long arguments about when the proper time begins for Christmas music). Others would just as soon skip the whole thing. And some parse out their feelings not based on the genre in general, but on the basis of individual tunes. You might have particular songs that you can do without (I love you Paul McCartney, but I don't need to hear "Wonderful Christmastime" more than once a year, and I don't need to hear "Grandma Got Run Over by a Reindeer" ever again, even after I once had a conversation with the guy who wrote it). But I would guess that even the most jaded Scrooge has a particularly favorite Christmas song. For me, I've always loved "O Little Town of Bethlehem." (I especially like the Bob Dylan version, which you can find on YouTube, but I must warn is not for everyone). Whenever I hear that song, I can't help but reflect on the lyrics (which isn't always the case with other Christmas songs).

The author of the lyrics, Phillips Brooks wrote the words after literally visiting Bethlehem in 1866. He came back home to Pennsylvania to a fragile nation just after the Civil War and the assassination of Lincoln. And he wrote lines like "O morning stars, together proclaim the holy birth, and praises sing to God the King, and peace to men on earth." The line that has always gotten me is the end of verse 1: "Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light; the hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight." The long story of human sin and divine redemption, the story of our suffering and struggling and our anticipation and our desire and our hope—all of those parts of our stories find their culmination in the baby born in the dark streets of a small village two thousand years ago!

And yet another line from the song speaks to us today: "No ear may hear His coming, but in this world of sin, where meek souls will receive Him still, the dear Christ enters in." This line is as true as it was 150 years ago when Brooks wrote it, and just as true as it was two thousand years ago when the dear Christ entered into this world of sin. So this year for Advent and Christmas worship services at Bethany, we will use the theme "The Dear Christ Enters In" to frame our worship. We will see how the dear Christ seeks to enter every aspect of our lives and stories. We look at what happens when Christ enters in and makes our hearts his home. And we will see how our approach to the entire season changes when our focus is not on what we do (or what we think we *have* to do), but on what Christ does for us when He enters. We might even hear Christmas music differently! "We hear the Christmas angels, the great glad tidings tell;

O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel!"




