The date chosen happens to be 27 years and 1 day from my installation at Our Savior in Sheboygan. This was a very hard decision on account of the Christian love shown to me, Julie, Rachel, Sarah, and Nathan. It has been 18 wonderful years at Bethany.

According to Missouri Synod guidelines, as of July 28, 2024, I will no longer be the called Pastor of Bethany. This means that after that date, I will be removed from active roster status. After July 28, 2024, Pastor Kretschmar will assign a vacancy Pastor. This Pastor will arrange pulpit supply and a visitation Pastor.

Upon retirement, I plan to take time to visit Nathan and Sarah and be grandpa to Ezekiel, Eli, and Evangelina. We do not plan to move from the area.


LADIES OF BETHANY

The Meaning of the Widow's Mite

During the time of Herod, mites were the smallest denomination coin in Judea. The term "widow's mite" is based on Luke 21:1-4:

As Jesus looked up, He saw the rich putting their gifts into the temple treasury. He also saw a poor widow put in two very small copper coins. "Truly I tell you," He said, "this poor widow has put in more than all the others. All these people gave their gifts out of their wealth, but she, out of her poverty, put in all she had to live on."

As the Bible reminds us, even small offerings can make an enormous impact. The Mite Box is intended for regular contributions of "mites" – offerings above and beyond the support given to congregations and the LCMS.


