Prayer as an act of faith.

This Lent, we have been learning again the meaning of the Lord's prayer. Prayer is an act of faith for Christians. We can't see God or hear directly from Him apart from His written word, yet every day, we direct our needs and concerns to God, confident that He hears and answers our prayers.

Prayer is an act of faith also because what we see with our eyes is often the opposite of what we pray for. Instead of peace, we see war; instead of love, we see anger. Instead of forgiveness, we see hatred. Instead of mercy, we all too often see judgment. Instead of kind words, we all too often hear only slander. Yet we continue to pray for all those things because we believe that God's will is that all evil will be brought to an end.

Prayer is also an act of faith because we know we have allowed ourselves to be on the wrong side of God's will and commandments. We see the harm caused all around us by our sins. Our sins deserve God to be angry with us and to punish us for them. Just like any child in a family who sins against their parents deserves to be punished, so do we by God for our sins.

Yet, we continue to pray to God. We pray because of Christ and what He has done for us and the faith and trust that what Christ has done has earned for us forgiveness of our sins. Our chief prayer as Christians is to confess our sins to God. We boldly confess our sins to God and to our own consciences because faith in Christ tells us that on Good Friday, Jesus earned for us forgiveness for every one of our sins.

One of the blessings of God in our lives is that He has given us the Holy Ministry. It is through this Ministry that we hear the Words of God directed to us. The Absolution is God's response to our confession of sins. "If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9) We hear again that truth in our ears so that we don't have to wonder or guess if we have been forgiven; we know that in the Name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, we are forgiven.

Knowing this great and wonderful gift that is given to us drives us as Christians to pray even more for all of our needs. God who took care of our biggest need by having His own Son die for us, how will He not give to us every need of body and soul. This is what faith is. To believe that because of Jesus we have a Father who hears and answers our prayers always for our good.

Faith also tells us that when we don't see the answer for our prayer in the way we want or in our timing, we don't despair. We have an advocate with Father, Jesus, (1 John 2:1) and we know the Spirit groans for us in words that we don't understand. (Romans 8). They bring our prayers to the Father, and He answers them through them and their work in our lives in the way that is best for us and our neighbor eternally.

So, the Christian life of faith is always expressed in prayer. Prayer looks to God for help, leaves things to God's direction, gives us peace and rest for our days, reassures us through trouble and difficulty, and delivers us from temptation and despair. What a great and wonderful gift prayer is!
