NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT

On Sunday, April 21, Bethany recognized its 115th anniversary and celebrated with a catered dinner in the fellowship hall in the basement. All thanks and praise to our glorious Lord for the many blessings we've had over the years! We have much to be thankful for....a loving congregation that feels like family, Pastor Steele and all of our previous pastors for their leadership, financial stability, and a beautiful church building. Special thanks to the Altona Supper Club in New Holstein for providing such delicious food as well as all the volunteers who helped do the planning, set-up, and cleanup for the event. It was wonderful and enjoyed by all!



For those who were unable to attend the dinner, I thought I'd share a few of the fun facts about our church history that I shared with the group that day:

- 1. The first worship service was held on November 20, 1908, in a vacated Episcopal Church that was on the same property we are on today.
- 2. April 11, 1909 which happened to be an Easter Sunday Reverend George Burger officially founded the church, naming it "Bethania Gemeinde UAC".
- 3. At the time, our village of Kohler was known as "Riverside".
- 4. The newly founded congregation purchased the vacated church building and property for \$1100 and dedicated it on Jun 14, 1909.
- 5. It wasn't actually until 1941 that they started building our current church, finishing it in 1942 and dedicated it on August 9th that same year.
- 6. In 1948 they purchase the pipe organ we have today for \$9000 (today that would be approx. \$118K)
- 7. In 1950, they purchased and installed the bells in the bell tower for \$6050.
- 8. The church had an orchestra back in those days.
- 9. They had both German and English services.
- 10. We've had 10 pastors serve at this church. The longest serving pastor was Herbert Baker who served for 26 years from 1955 until 1981.

It's interesting what you find in the archives across from Pastor's office. If you're ever interested in learning more about our church history, stop in and peruse the binders that Betty Bawden worked so hard to put together for us. There is a lot of great information, including old photos, newspaper articles, and even church bulletins from back in the early 1900's stored in there. Check it out!

Just a little update on the church lawn...last fall, we had our snow removal service take care of the lawn, by thatching, aerating, and reseeding it. Gina worked hard to keep it watered for the first few weeks after the seeding. A little bit of grass grew back, but it still has a long way to go. The second part of this effort will begin in the near future. We just need the weather to stay above 45 degrees at night and to have a stretch of dry weather so the ground can harden up. Then he will come back to thatch and reseed again. Prayerfully, we'll have our yard looking nice again by next fall.
