Shortly after this article is printed absentee voting by will have already begun in Wisconsin. What a great gift God has given to us in allowing us to consider and choose for ourselves who will lead us in our governments. He gave this gift to the Israelites for their local governments in Deuteronomy 1:13: "Choose some wise, understanding and respected men from each of your tribes, and I will set them over you."

As sinful human beings we don't always choose the wisest and best to lead us. We often choose people who are unable or unwilling to fill their duties. When we have had good and honest leaders who are willing to serve the people this country has thrived.

Proverbs 14:34: "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin condemns any people."

Proverbs 29:2: "When the righteous thrive, the people rejoice; when the wicked rule, the people groan."

Even the best of leaders though are still sinners. The Lord warned the Israelites to not ask for a King because he would love power and wealth and take more and more for himself. There is a natural inclination on our part to love ourselves first and our neighbors less and to exalt ourselves over others. Even when they are enacting policy or law for the best of intentions it often goes awry.

Missouri Synod Lutherans especially have always been very wary of the State. Our existence as a Synod can be traced to Governmental intrusion on matters of faith. On September 27th, 1817, King Ferdinand Willian III ordered the Lutheran liturgy of communion to be abandoned in favor of the Reformed to force the two church bodies into one church. If any Lutheran pastors were caught using the Lutheran liturgy they were imprisoned and defrocked. Seeing this as too much to bear and violating their conscience the Lutherans set sail for Perry County Missouri so that they could worship God the way their conscience said was right and to train their children to do the same.

The "Brief Statement of doctrinal position" of 1932 says this: **We condemn the policy of those who would have** the power of the State employed "in the interest of the Church" and who thus turn the Church into a secular dominion; as also of those who, aiming to govern the State by the Word of God, seek to turn the State into a Church.

As Christians we have a King who reigns over us and all the earth. He gives us what we need for this body and life through the governments of our homes where father and mother provide for the house and the state to keep the peace and allow people to live in peace and quietness.

The church is given to us by God to preach God's Word that sinners would be saved. The church has not been given to us by God to be the state and wherever the church lays aside the preaching and Sacraments to try to be the state she almost always ends up in error. Faith can never be imposed on a person by force of might. It is to be believed.

Likewise, the State should never try to impose any doctrine on people with the power of laws and the police. We may like the idea of the Bible being taught in schools but who will teach it? How will they teach it? Are we to have a Buddhist teaching the Bible to our children? Or should we leave the teaching to the Church? The state should stay out of all matters of religion so that the Gospel may be freely preached to sinners to free them from the tyranny of sin, death, and the devil. Only by preaching are consciences given peace with God. The state cannot impose forgiveness, nor should it impose any doctrine that robs our consciences of that peace.

Also, the state should not impose any teaching that is contrary to our ability to lead peaceful lives with integrity. We don't want to be told we have to conform to laws that are against God and His will. Daniel lived in a society that was clearly against God and he had to suffer for his faithfulness. If it were to come to that so would we willingly suffer as we commend our lives to God and not to an earthly kingdom or man. We would remember that the church has spent a large part of her existence worshipping not on padded pews but in catacombs to escape governmental intrusion.

So, if you have read all of this to get to the point where I tell you who to vote for, sorry, I am not going to do that. All the candidates share one defining trait, they are all sinners. They all see government as the solution to our problem but none of them will save us or deliver us what we really need. We have One King who rules overall and He is bringing us home to be with Him forever. None of the candidates will give us that. So, vote freely with your conscience as your guide and rest.


ADULT BIBLE STUDY
