### **PASTOR'S PAGE**

This month of Bethany will gather again as children of God to seek His will for you, as you will call a pastor to come and serve you. This will be the fourth time you have done this, which means you are becoming experts at the process, albeit begrudgingly.

I know I have learned a lot about the call process in our Synod. Before this, I had never been on the "other" side of a Divine Call. Now I know more about the struggles, hopes, and disappointments that come with this time. As your vacancy pastor, I have heard your stories and listened to what you would hope would happen, and I have also been here to listen to your frustrations. Thank you for letting me into that conversation. You will help me when I am faced with helping guide a congregation to find their next pastor. I pray that you have been blessed to see the larger working of our Synod, as many pastors have come to serve you in your time of need.

Some of the things I have learned in this process are eye-opening. I learned just this past Monday at our Circuit Visitor meeting that the average vacancy time for a congregation now stands at 18 months. I learned the biggest struggle for most congregations in finding a new pastor is affording the salary and benefits as they keep going up. I learned that vacancy really starts when the pastor first says he is really thinking about retirement. Which means you have been in vacancy for a lot longer than 1 year.

Through this process, what I have learned most of all is to trust that the work of the church will continue unabated. It may look different from week to week, but it won't stop. The Word of God has continued to be taught and preached. People have had their sins forgiven, and the Lord's Supper, where heaven and earth collide as Jesus comes to us, has been celebrated regularly. Why have those things continued? That is just what the church is and does. Those are the things that make us children of God. Those are the things that give us the firm foundation of the solid rock of Christ in our lives. These are the gifts God gives to those He has chosen.

The verse I've chosen to share with you is Jesus speaking directly to you. You don't choose him, He chooses you. He knows you. He is with you. And the fruit that you are to bear is the faith that you are given abundantly by His work in Word and Sacrament. It is these that let us rest in Him at the end of the day.



### STEVE MAROTZ and LEE GUMM – VIETNAM VETERANS



The "Old Glory Honor Flight #75", to Washington D.C., took off from the EAA on Friday, July 25. Among 94 Vietnam veterans were Steve Marotz and Lee Gumm. Their "Guardians" were sons Ben and Tim, respectively. This started November 30, 2023 when paperwork was sent in. It takes that long once you apply to actually get the call. Steve graduated from Sheboygan Falls High School in 1967 and joined the Army August 21, 1969. His Basic Training took place at Fort Campbell, Kentucky. He then went to Fort Hood Texas, where he worked for the Inspector General. He served in Vietnam from September 1970 to September 1971 as an Administrative Specialist. He finished his time in the Army at the Army Recruiting Command, Minneapolis as a budget officer. He was discharged on February 24, 1972.

Lee Graduated from Kohler High School in 1966. He joined the U.S. Army about 6 months after graduation at age 18. His Basic Training was at Fort Ord, California. He then got his Photo-Lab training at the 69<sup>th</sup> Signal Battalion, Fort Monmouth New Jersey. He left for Vietnam on June 2, 1967. He served in the 221<sup>st</sup> Signal Company, Tan San Nhut for nine months, then moved to Cam Rahn Bay, working in "air-conditioned" photo-labs. He departed from there on July 2, 1968. Lee finished his time in the Army at Fort Rucker Alabama, where he managed the office of the 53<sup>rd</sup> Aviation Battalion Headquarters. His discharge took place on August 29, 1969.



This Honor Flight took those 94 Viet Nam veterans to Washington D.C. for the purpose of letting them see the Vietnam "wall" and related monuments. We also went to the Museum of American History. It was there that we were directed to the areas explaining the evolution of the American Flag and the National Anthem. We also saw the vast area dedicated to memorabilia and actual equipment used in the Vietnam war. The day passed quickly, it was about 99 degrees, so lots of water was consumed. Because of our late start (2 hour flight delay out of Oshkosh), we had to scratch Arlington Cemetery from itinerary. On our return flight we had "Mail Call". If it was not already emotional by that point, it certainly was as we read all the cards and letters we received. There were tears. We returned to the EAA at 7:30pm. Estimates of 40 thousand people greeted us upon our return. We were so honored to have our sons Ben and Tim, serving as our guardians (a requirement on these flights). We will all remember that time for eternity. After we landed, all guardians had to get off of the plane. Next the Vets came off, it was "Their Time" now, and it was unbelievable coming down the steps and seeing all the people, then walking at least 300' flanked on both sides by all active duty personnel. They saluted and offered handshakes. After all that, the best came, seeing our family members and an "ocean" of others who wanted to experience this moment.

So thank you to ALL of you who participated in the "Mail Call" and to those who took the time to write notes, phone call, text, give personal face-to-face thanks and e-mail us before and after the event. There were still cards coming in the mailbox too! We have truly been blessed to have had this experience, but the best blessings are our families, siblings, relatives, friends, neighbors and Bethany members. Please know you are loved and a very important part of **US**.
