I would like every member to click on the "Google Doc" above. It is a good read for pastors and the layperson. Don't be intimidated with odd words. Some I don't even remember what they mean. It is an important read.

We, as pastors, have been struggling on how to minister to our church families during this world wide health crisis. People are dying from complications from the virus, one's underlying conditions, the lack of preventive care (elected surgeries), and depression.

The main mission of the devil it to isolate Christians. Many of us have watched "Animal Planet", "Discovery", "National Geographic" and the like. When a predator decides to go after its prey, it looks for the most vulnerable (the young, the injured, the diseased, and the elderly). The devil does exactly the same thing. The Bible teaches that the devil is a murderer and has always been a murderer. His goal is to murder as many as he can and he wants hell to be their resting place.

I would like to share reflections on two funerals I officiated this month. A few months ago, these funerals would not have taken place. The families gathered from all over the country to celebrate their loved one's new life in Christ. One was held at the cemetery in the shade on very hot Saturday morning and the other at Bethany. Friends and family honored these loved ones by celebrating their earthly life and their new life with our Lord and Savior. The loved ones honored their family member beautifully by creating Christ centered worship. This was very God pleasing. Thankfully we are slowly getting back to normal.

However, the devil does not want a return to normal. He wants Christians to be separated from each other. The devil thwarts Christians by creating fear, doubts and human complacency. We pastors have seen a cross section of our congregations not worshipping. Getting people to worship has always been an issue. Ironically, the least vulnerable among us, the young. Under normal circumstances the young are not beating down the doors of the church, but those who regularly or semi-regularly worship. They've been absent.

As pastors we wonder. Is it fear? Is it complacency? At these two funerals, young families mingled with the elderly members of their families. Again, these families were from all over the country. As they began to mingle the masks came off from both family and friends. Prior to the funeral many were hesitant (fearful) to have so many from all over come back. The fear dissipated when all gathered around God's Word as a community of believers, the family of God. The church is a family. We are all blood relatives. We have been washed and fed by the blood of Jesus.

As pastors, another issue since we have been slowly opening up is offering private home communions for the most vulnerable. Yes, nursing homes are still closed. As pastors we are trying to get the area ones to relinquish their strict guidelines. Some have begun to open up, thankfully. We as pastors take the necessary precautions to commune those that are vulnerable.

Finally, Bethany, our sound leadership has been working diligently to have worship restored fully but cautiously. Worship throughout history (during war, epidemic, and all out persecution) has and will be the center of our Christian life

There are changes that are occurring this fall. We will be adding another service. We also will be celebrating 1st communion for Ryan Mengel and Aidan Brooks on August 2nd. We also will be celebrating Confirmation for Grace Matte, Thomas Yang, and Annalise Hasler in September. Both rites had been postponed. They will go off on these days. The Church is moving forward for these young people. "May God be the Glory"

JULY/AUGUST MISSION OF THE MONTH – Lutheran Deaf Mission Society (LDMS)

It is estimated that approximately ninety-eight percent of Deaf people in the United States do not attend church. This is, in part, due to the limited number of deaf churches. While the number of full-time pastors serving Deaf churches has decreased, the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod has seen an increase in the number of Deaf pastors, deacons, deaconesses, and lay leaders who use sign language to communicate the Gospel message. This has happened because of programs like <u>Deaf Pah</u> and the <u>Deaf Institute of Theology</u>. LDMS will engage in evangelism and Christian education training to help Deaf Persons and their families see Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and engage in stewardship and leadership training to help Deaf Persons serve Jesus Christ.
