Has the End Arrived?!

Mark 13:7-8 "And when you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed. This must take place, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. These are but the beginning of the birth pains."

We are living in very anxious times. The year 2020 has been a wakeup call so to speak! Maybe not for Christians but for the rest of the World. Every Christian generation since Jesus' ascension have been waiting for his return. Many, as you may today, believe we are living on cusp of Jesus' 2nd coming. Jesus tells us in Mark 13 that no one knows the day or the hour of the 2nd coming. The church's song since the Ascension is "Come Quickly Lord, Quickly Come!"

I was spending time with some members a few weeks ago. Our conversation centered around the riots that are happening in our major cities. I stated: "It's just like the race riots of '67 and '68. I received a blank look and realized no one I was speaking to was born yet! Now I understand I am old. I can remember the race riots in Detroit. Our little house on Sutherland Ave. in Warren, Michigan was on the Huey Helicopter flight path from Selfridge Air Force Base in Mt. Clemens, Michigan to Detroit. These copters were transporting National Guard troops to and from the Detroit rioting hotspots.

For the succeeding years until recently the city of Detroit never recovered. These began the "Flight Years". Many, like my aunt and uncle and cousins, left Detroit and settled in Mackinaw City and scrimped out a living. Over last few years, urban living has been on the rise as young high achieving millennials have been moving back to the city. These blighted areas were slowly having an urban renaissance.

Sadly, with these current rounds of riots, this renaissance could be snuffed out too. Thankfully Detroit did not burn like Minneapolis, New York, Chicago, and Seattle. Now those living in Minneapolis have witnessed an increase of 20% of homes going on the market in the city proper. Minneapolis, a city my wife and I visited much in our youth, was a place where a murder or rape was an anomaly. Now rioting and civil unrest is causing people to flee. If the Detroit of the late 60's has barely recovered and it's been just over 50 years, what is going to happen to modern cities like Minneapolis, Chicago, and New York?

Out rite fear is motivating people to begin to flee from these cities of unrest. Young married couples will not raise their children in harm's way. They will escape.

Why such reflection? People, if they can afford too, will try to escape and settle where they feel safe. Sadly though, they will physically flee to escape the unknown fear of violence or even death. People will always flee for safety. Fathers and mothers want to preserve and protect their family.

However, when it comes to Jesus 2nd coming, there will be no place to hide. No one can escape. John's book of Revelation states: "When he opened the sixth seal, I looked, and behold, there was a great earthquake, and the sun became black as sackcloth, the full moon became like blood, and the

stars of the sky fell to the earth as the fig tree sheds its winter fruit when shaken by a gale. The sky vanished like a scroll that is being rolled up, and every mountain and island was removed from its place. Then the kings of the earth and the great ones and the generals and the rich and the powerful, and everyone, slave and free, hid themselves in the caves and among the rocks of the mountains, calling to the mountains and rocks, "Fall on us and hide us from the face of him who is seated on the throne, and from the wrath of the Lamb, for the great day of their wrath has come, and who can stand?"" (Rev 6:12-16)

All of what we are experiencing are the birth pains of a new heaven and a new earth. Those who are under the cross need not fear because the blood of the slain lamb flows over them. Sadly, those who do not believe in the resurrected and ascended Christ will be scrambling for safety and none will be found. Safety is found only in the pierced hands of Christ.

We are living in uncertain times. We are one day closer to the 2nd Coming than yesterday. The church does not quiver, hide or turn in on itself, but she lifts her eyes heaven ward waiting patiently for her bridegroom, the Son of God, Jesus Christ. No matter where a Christian resides, they first and foremost reside with the Savior of the World. Our cry is "Come Quickly Lord, Quickly Come!" This world will pass away, with all its riots, wars, rumors of wars, famine, and yes, pandemics. Moreover, the church will be unscathed and glorified on that great day. The church will be gathered around God's thrown worshipping the "Lamb of God" who takes away the sins of the world.
