#### "WOKE"

The word "woke" was first used by the New York Times in 1962. "Woke" is the past participle of the word "wake". "Woke" used to mean "conscious and aware" but more recently, the word "woke" has been redefined chiefly to mean "alert to racial or social discrimination and injustice." Black Lives Matter, LGBTQ, and ANTIFA use this definition as a litmus test to determine who is "Woke". Ironically, these groups definition is very fluid. When one is judged to be or not to be "Woke", there is no rhyme or reason to who is "qualified" or "non-qualified" as "Woke". If you are confused, you are not alone.

So, what does this have to do with Christianity? Words are being redefined throughout our culture. As of June 18<sup>th</sup>, we have a new national holiday, Juneteenth Day. This holiday is celebrated on June 19<sup>th</sup> to commemorate the emancipation of enslaved people in the US. The holiday was first celebrated in Texas, where on that date in 1865, in the aftermath of the Civil War, slaves were declared free under the terms of the 1863 Emancipation Proclamation. President Lincoln issued this Executive order that all slaves are free in all states, including the rebellious states. This proclamation led to the passage of the 13th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. Sadly, President Lincoln never celebrated this political victory because he was shot dead in April. Andrew Johnson, Lincoln's VP, signed into law that following December.

President Lincoln was an avid student of the Bible, though Lincoln never attended church services like many of the founding fathers of this great nation. Whether they were all believers, it's not known, but many were and those who were not were still raised Christian. Christianity and its Biblical morality led to the phrase: "All men are created equal by their Creator..." The Founders understood that slavery would be a great tension in the young nation. So, to win the task at hand, The Revolution, the Founders punted the slavery issue down the road. The slave states, all in the south, would not support the Revolution.

Many of us fail to understand that slavery was instituted by the British Empire. This institution was forced on the colonists. Even from the beginning many if not all the Northern states rejected slavery. Since our founding fathers were British subjects, slavery was part of their culture. Ironically, the slave trade was abolished by King George III in 1807, some 53 years before the Civil War. Why no civil war in the British Empire? For the same reason we revolted. The King had absolute power and he ruled absolutely. If you disagreed, off with your head. Literally!

Are you "Woke"? Did you know that Christians fought against Christians in the Civil War? As a child I grew up believing that the Confederates were not Christian. I was not "Woke!" They all worshipped the same God and sang the same hymns. Even the enslaved were converted into Christianity. They converted to the religion of their slave masters. When freedom arrived, the former slaves held to their Christian faith. Over the years many a hymn was created and sung that came out of slavery. The slaves became "Woke" to Christianity and the true God. Only God can do such things! Praise the Lord!

As you read this newsletter article, the 4th of July is fast approaching. What was the battle that changed the fortune of our Civil War? If you answered Gettysburg, you would be correct. Do you know the dates this great battle was fought? It was on the eve of our nation's 87<sup>th</sup> birthday. It was fought July 1st through July 3rd, 1863. Remember Lincolns Gettysburg Address "4 score and 7 years ago" A score is equal to 20 years (20 x4 = 80) plus 7 years = 87. Do you know the name of the ridge that General Meads army held? At this ridge, General Picket had roughly 6,000 casualties (dead and wounded). This was almost on-half of Pickett's division.

The ridge name was Cemetery. It was associated with the towns church and seminary, which so happened to be Lutheran, not Missouri though. Today, the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America and its Seminary still exists at Gettysburg. Are you "Woke" now?

Christians killed Christians over slavery. President Lincoln practiced the Christian faith. He gave up his life to free the slaves. The decisive battle was fought in the shadow of a Lutheran Seminary and its church. Sadly, the Civil War was decided by Christians. Our God wept upon all this slaughter. After the smoke clears many a Union "blue belly" and a Confederate, "Jonny Reb" passed together through the valley of the shadow of death. Now you are "Woke"!

I would like to thank my Junior High School Teacher, Mr. Lyson for the bulk of my being "Woke." I wonder if you test high schoolers today if they are "Woke" to US History.

Sadly, this will never be taught under CRT - Cultural Race Theory. So be wary of what's happening at our school board meetings throughout Sheboygan County. Don't be asleep - be "WOKE!"

LDMS will engage in evangelism and Christian education training to help Deaf Persons and their families see Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and engage in stewardship and leadership training to help Deaf Persons serve Jesus Christ. - Continue to pray for Alaric


