

## PASTOR'S PAGE

Dear Christian Friends,

How was your Easter? With sincere gratitude to Lee and Julie, we were able to record the Holy Week Services on Wednesday and Thursday. There is no doubt about it, it made the actual Easter Sunday anticlimactic. Though we celebrated Easter, we could not assemble due to the safer-at-home orders.

I'll have to relate a funny story about Easter though. I got up at about 5 am on Easter Sunday wide awake. So, I turned on the news and watched the Pope officiate a Mass and then I listened to his address. It was in Latin but it had an interpreter. The entire basilica was practically empty other than those who attend to the Pope. "Dear brothers and sisters, indifference, self-centeredness, division, and forgetfulness are not words we want to hear at this time. We want to ban these words forever. They seem to prevail when fear and death overwhelm us, that is, when we do not let the Lord Jesus triumph in our hearts and lives..." The Pope wanted to ban indifference, self-centeredness, division and forgetfulness forever. Good intention, except people by nature are indifferent, self-centered, divisive, and forgetful of God and their neighbor. Luther summarized these human negative qualities as the "Old Adam" that dwells in each of us.

Through the regeneration of the new man given to us by the Holy Spirit through baptism. We live in a sinful world. We live with these sinful eruptions: disease, pestilences, war, famine, flooding, and the like. We live in a fallen world. As much as we want to eradicate such outburst within ourselves and the world, it will never be done on this side of eternity. However, we are given the means to daily drown the "Old Adam". When this nature is drowned, the new-person springs forth with specifically, designed by God, given qualities which Paul describes in Galatians 5: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control...During times like this, these qualities spring forth, even when we are struggling with those qualities that the Pope wanted to ban forever. The gifts of the Spirit motivated the Christian to spring into action. These gifts are God driven. God driven in fatally flawed human beings. When these actions spring forth, God the Holy Spirit is credited. This is the miracle of God working in us sinful followers of Christ.

Over these last few weeks, we see God the Holy Spirit working through Christians to help those who are suffering. This is done by donations to Christian medical teams, by Christians extending God's healing to our neighbor through a thoughtful note or e-card. These neighbors can be believers or non-believers. God is not indifferent to those in need. God's heart breaks because of our suffering. God loves all, even those who are ill. God's hands are found in every situation. God never sleeps. However, God uses such illnesses to bring about three things: 1) death to believer or non-believer; 2) physical healing to both; 3) Repentance to both. God uses illness or plagues to call all to Himself. Life is fragile. It sometimes takes a virus to wake us up from our false sense of "invincibility". Remember, God uses bad times to remove the scales from our own eyes. Our eyes are refocused on the crucified and risen Son of God. God's Son is calling us to His bosom with outstretched scarred hands.

I am always reminded by the account in Luke 17: *"On the way to Jerusalem he was passing along between Samaria and Galilee. And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices, saying, 'Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.' When he saw them,*

he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus answered, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" And he said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well." How many were healed? All ten? Jesus did not discriminate. He healed every one of them! Even though only one came back to praise and thank God. Faith will always reveal the source of the healing. It comes from the Lord!

In conclusion, after listening to the Pope, Julie and I listened to two Easter services. One from Perryville, MO where Nathan and Alicia are serving. The other was from Fraser, MI where Julie grew up. They were beautiful services. I love Easter music and sang all the hymns. However, I did something that I never thought I would do. After the sermon hymn, I listened to the opening Easter Text...The next thing I knew. I was awakened by an Easter hymn. I missed the sermon, not once, but twice. Jesus said to the disciples the night He was betrayed in the Garden: "The Spirit is willing but the flesh is weak!" I am absolutely sure that nobody at Bethany did what I did with one of my sermons? Not!!!! I guess I was good enough because I listened to the Pope! I stayed awake...I think Luther would have had a great laugh! I know Julie did.

I pray everything is going well with isolation. Soon, this shall pass and we will be back worshipping together.

## FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

Dear Members of Bethany,

This is a unique time for our Church and our Community, Safety is always our top priority and taking care of the wellbeing of our congregation, staff and charities continue to be at the forefront of our Mission. This report is to give you an update on the current status and actions we are taking to ensure financial health of our Church.

We are not at risk of being able to pay our bills. Due to your generosity and our fiscal responsibility, our cash accounts are at healthy levels; however, 87% of our cash is designated to specific accounts per the requests of the donors. Our Congregation has been trending towards more specific donations for projects such as the organ improvement, elevator, general improvement and special needs accounts. This appears to have reduced general fund donations. Our target is to have at least 2 months of general fund savings for budgeted items, however due to this giving trend and the reduced giving due in part to COVID-19, our savings only accounts for 1 month of budgeted items. While this is not a problem today, it can be a future risk to meeting the wishes of our donors and paying all our budgetary commitments. To make sure this risk does not become a problem, here is our plan.

**Cutting Costs:** We consider approximately 85% of our budget to be fixed commitments, allowing us to only flex about 15% of our spend with things like custodian needs, worship materials, certain hourly employee expenses, etc. These items can be temporarily suspended without major disruption. Here is a high level summary of the current plan:

- Payroll – Salaries continuing as scheduled; Hourly reduced to match demand
- Charities & Missions - Continuing as scheduled
- Projects – Committee discretion, reserved funds are still available
- Utilities & Insurance – Continuing as scheduled

**Seek CARES Act funds:** We are applying for the government's CARES Act funds (Paycheck Protection Program) that is intended for small businesses and not-for-profit organizations to get financial relief in the form of a forgivable loan. We are seeking these funds solely for the purpose of payroll and utility payments that will be forgivable, meaning we don't have to pay the loan back to the government.

**Continued Generosity:** That's you. As a congregation, we have been blessed by the support of all our members. During these tough times we find it even more important to support our mission at Bethany and your weekly offerings and contributions make the mission possible. If physically not attending Church has made giving difficult, please consider signing up for Bethany's e-giving program "Joyful Response". Even the slightest of additional support can go a long way.

If you have questions or are interested in seeing a more detailed report, please feel free to contact the Finance Committee or Treasurer. If you would like to sign up for "Joyful Response" e-giving, please see information below. There's so much going on at Bethany and tons to be proud of. If this virus has an impact, let the impact fall on the willingness and opportunities for people to receive and share God's word. That should be our goal.

**Sunday School Mission Project:** This year's SS mission is Compassion International where we sponsored two children that are currently living in poverty. The offerings we collect for these children will help provide health monitoring and care, nutritional support, food, healthy recreation, educational and learning activities, and the opportunity to learn about Jesus. ## FROM THE BOARD OF ELDERS

Dear members of Bethany,

The elders have been meeting frequently over the past month to discuss how to handle our worship schedule amidst this pandemic that has swept our nation. Our number one priority was the safety of our members, and with the orders from the governor to stay home, it helped make clear what our decision needed to be. To help keep getting the word out to the congregation, Pastor Steele has been making videos and posting them online on YouTube and Facebook. I'd like to personally thank Pastor, Julie, and Lee Gumm for the fantastic job they have been doing with these videos. I hope everyone has had a chance to watch them.

**Opportunity for Communion:** As we've continued to monitor the situation in Sheboygan County, we can see the number of COVID-19 cases have been very limited and the spread has been very slow. With the extension of the Safer-at-Home order prolonging our opportunity to gather here at church, we feel it was important to offer some worship opportunities at the church. That said, Pastor Steele will be holding small services, beginning this Sunday, where he will be doing the confession and absolution, a small reading, and communion. These services will begin at 10:00 AM this Sunday, April 26, and will run every half-hour for a single family or individual at each service. To attend one of these services, you must sign up by contacting Gina in the church office and she will assign you a time slot, as they will just be added every half hour in the order the requests are received (you will need to do this each week that you'd like to attend). Please be assured that Pastor Steele will be sanitizing everything between visits but if you are someone at high-risk, are showing symptoms, or just don't feel comfortable going out yet, we encourage you to remain home and continue following the safer-at-home orders.

**Adult Bible Study:** Another worship opportunity that we will be offering is an online Bible class on Tuesday evenings at 6:00 PM, starting April 28 led by Pastor Steele. Again, please sign up with Gina in the church office so she can get a list of attendees and Pastor will send out the study materials and link to the online class ahead of time.
