For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. (Matthew 6:19-21)"

Many have asked how Julie and I are doing. Do you need anything? What can we do to help? Your gracious outpouring has been well received. There are many things to be thankful for. No one was hurt in the blaze. There was no loss of life. My neighbors, the Seer's, had no smoke or fire damage. Our duplex has a well-constructed firewall. It did its job. Our dog and the quail I've been raising are all safe. The quail are now living in the backyard aviary soon to be released into the wild.

Finally, we thank our God for you the members of Bethany. Over the years we have always remembered you in our prayers. For the times when you suffered a loss. You see, we are in a partnership to support each other in time of needs. Our partnership in the Gospel has brought the Good News of Jesus Christ into Kohler, Sheboygan, Sheboygan Falls and beyond. This brings Julie and I great joy because of such a partnership. Julie and I hold each of you in our heart.

How do we get through such tragedies? Prayer. Being with our Lord and Savior, sitting at his feet. Julie and I would like to let you know your prayers are getting us through this valley along life's way. Again, thank for all your uplifting notes and cards. The Bethany family is truly a blessing to us. Again, thank you for keeping us in your prayers. They do help. They do not go unanswered.


Long Awaited Organ Recital
